

TRAUMA-FOCUSED COGNITIVE BEHAVIORAL THERAPY *A Skills Based Training*

Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) is a short-term, evidence-based treatment for children, ages 3 to 18, who have experienced trauma and their caregivers. This components-based psychotherapy model incorporates trauma-sensitive interventions with cognitive behavioral, family, and humanistic principles. TF-CBT is empirically supported for use with youth impacted by trauma and co-occurring mental health problems. It is designated a Model Program by SAMHSA's National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN) and has received the highest scientific rating as a Well-Supported-Effective Practice by the California Evidence-Based Clearinghouse for Child Welfare. Clinical research shows that TF-CBT significantly reduces children's symptoms of PTSD and improves overall mental health in children and caregivers.

This two-day pre-conference training (October 28 & 29, 2013) will provide you with a comprehensive understanding of TF-CBT as well as hands-on opportunities to practice TF-CBT components such as:

- Psychoeducation & Parenting Strategies
- Relaxation
- Affective Expression & Regulation
- Cognitive Coping
- Trauma Narrative & Processing
- In Vivo Exposure
- Conjoint Parent Child Sessions
- Enhancing Personal Safety & Future Growth

As a result of participating in this program, you will be able to:

- Identify & engage children and families who would benefit from TF-CBT;
- Describe the treatment components and underlying rationale for each component;
- Develop & practice skills to implement each treatment component;
- Practice several creative approaches for doing the trauma narrative;
- Apply strategies for addressing distorted / unhelpful trauma-related cognitions; and,
- Address common barriers to treatment implementation.

This special program will be lead by Kimberly Shipman, PhD, director of the Child Trauma Program at the Kempe Center at the University of Colorado's School of Medicine, a developmental and child clinical psychologist with expertise in child development, child trauma, parent-child communication, and evidence-based mental health treatment. Dr. Shipman also provides supervision and clinical service. She is an expert in Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and is a certified trainer who trained with Dr. Anthony P. Mannarino and other developers of this intervention. She will be joined by experts from Colorado and Utah.

To support you after this training, Dr. Shipman will offer phone consultation bi-monthly for 6 months with approximately 10 participants in each group. This consultation is necessary for TF-CBT Certification. (Costs and details will be arranged directly with Dr. Shipman.) Prior to attending this training, it is strongly recommended that you complete the free TF-CBT web course (<http://tfcbt.musc.edu/>) and receive its 10 CEUs. This will insure that all participants are at the same knowledge level.
